OCTOBER ~ MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY This month's feast was instituted in thanksgiving for the wide-spread praying of the Rosary, which saved Christian Europe being overrun by Islam at the Battle of Lapanto in 1571. Mass for the 29th Sunday in 'Ordinary Time'

Introit: To You I call; for You will surely heed me, O God; turn Your ear to me; hear my words. Guard me as the apple of Your eye; in the shadow of Your wings protect me

First Reading Isaiah 45: 1, 4-6

Thus says the Lord to His anointed, to Cyrus, whom He has taken by his right hand to subdue nations before him and strip the loins of kings, to force gateways before him that their gates be closed no more: 'It is for the sake of My servant Jacob, of Israel My chosen one, that I have called you by your name, conferring a title though you do not know Me. I am the Lord, unrivalled; there is no other God besides Me. Though you do not know Me, I arm you that men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun that, apart from Me, all is nothing.'

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm Psalm 95: 1, 3-5, 7-10

Give the Lord glory and power.

O sing a new song to the Lord, sing to the Lord all the earth. Tell among the nations His glory and His wonders among all the peoples.

The Lord is great and worthy of praise, to be feared above all gods; the gods of the heathens are naught. It was the Lord who made the heavens,

Give the Lord, you families of peoples, give the Lord glory and power; give the Lord the glory of His Name. Bring an offering and enter His courts.

We know, brothers, that God loves you and that you have been chosen, because when we brought the Good News to you, it came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit, and as utter conviction.

Gospel

Matthew 22: 15-21

The Pharisees went away to work out between them how to trap Jesus in what He said. And they sent their disciples to Him, together with the Herodians, to say, 'Master, we know that You are an honest man and teach the way of God in an honest way, and that You are not afraid of anyone, because a man's rank means nothing to You. Tell us Your opinion, then. Is it permissible to pay taxes to Caesar or not?' But Jesus was aware of their malice and replied, 'You hypocrites! Why do you set this trap for me? Let me see the money you pay the tax with.' They handed Him a denarius, and He said, 'Whose head is this? Whose name?' 'Caesar's' they replied. He then said to them, 'Very well, give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.'

The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Prayer Over the Offerings

Grant us, Lord, we pray, a sincere respect for Your gifts, that, through the purifying action of Your grace, we may be cleansed by the very mysteries we serve.

Communion Antiphon Behold, the eyes of the Lord are on those who fear Him, who hope in His merciful love, to rescue their souls from death, to keep them alive in famine.

Post Communion Prayer

Grant, O Lord, we pray, that, benefitting from participation in heavenly things, we may be helped by what You give in this present age and prepared for the gifts that are eternal. Through Christ...

Holy Communion is distributed after the end of Mass as the recommended safest option, for the Priest to re-sanitize his hands.

After the Priest says: *Behold, the Lamb of God...*, and our response, *Lord, I am not worthy...*, he now adds the declaration: *The Body of Christ*, to which all respond: *Amen*. This alleviates the need to say anything at the Communion rail, so please **do not** say Amen at the moment of receiving Holy Communion.

THE RITE OF RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION AFTER MASS

***You DO NOT need to stand**, as the Priest leaves the altar, but may rather **remain kneeling**, to say your Thanksgiving after Communion. Don't rush out of church. Stay and pray.*
