THE NOVEMBER LOCK-DOWN RESTRICTIONS are imposed despite our (and other) Bishops' letters to the Prime Minister. Churches are closed except for private prayer. We are open for 4 hours each day.

STEWARDS are needed to keep our church open during lock-down. Please speak to Sharon or Ann in the Parish Office if you can offer just 2 hours on any day, Monday to Saturday, either 9 - 11am, or 1 - 3pm.

HOLY HOURS of EUCHARISTIC EXPOSITION are increased from our usual Wednesday & Saturday (11am-12noon), to an hour earlier: **10-11am on 4 days: Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays & Saturdays.**

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY - 8th November - we offer the usual Solemn Requiem at 10.30am today, including the 2 minutes silence.

REQUIEM MASSES are offered on all unimpeded days in November. Join us live-stream to pray often for your departed relatives and friends.

From Fr Andrew's All Souls' Day Homily: When making your Will, take care to give instructions for your Catholic funeral, including a Requiem Mass. Our body has dignity: created in the image and likeness of God. It is a false humility to disregard the value of our body, either by not caring about our funeral, or by choosing the cheapest option. God has invested our body with dignity. By requesting a Requiem Mass and dignified Catholic funeral, you spare your loved ones the burden of making the decision themselves and provide them with the consolation of the Church's funeral rites, which say all we need to say about the departed.

If you are arranging a funeral, as next-of-kin, executor or a friend, know that the Church allows burial or, for a good reason, cremation, but never allows Catholics to scatter ashes after cremation. It is like throwing away something precious, and not consonant with the dignity of the human person. Every human body should have a final place of rest, so please always bury the ashes of a person whose body has been cremated. Remember: burying the dead is a corporal work of mercy.

Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 4: 13-18

We want you to be quite certain, brothers, about those who have died, to make sure that you do not grieve about them, like the other people who have no hope. We believe that Jesus died and rose again, and that it will be the same for those who have died in Jesus: God will bring them with Him. We can tell you this from the Lord's own teaching, that any of us who are left alive until the Lord's coming will not have any advantage over those who have died. At the trumpet of God, the voice of the archangel will call out the command and the Lord Himself will come down from Heaven; those who have died in Christ will be the first to rise, and then those of us who are still alive will be taken up in the clouds, together

Gospel Matthew 25: 1-13

Jesus told this parable to his disciples: 'The kingdom of Heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five were sensible: the foolish ones did take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out." But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'
