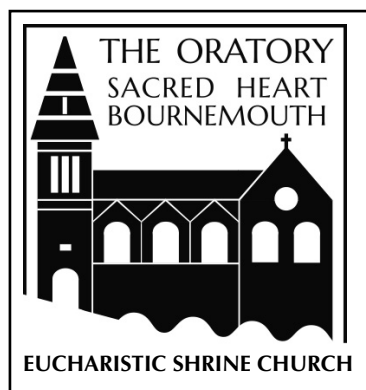

Dear Friends,

THE ORATORY is a **EUCCHARISTIC SHRINE CHURCH** designated by Bishop Philip for this Year of the Eucharist, welcoming parishes, groups and individuals coming on Pilgrimage and to gain the Plenary Indulgence.

We are hosting **The International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles** as part of our pilgrim programme, and have published a new mini-guide to the



Oratory Church, highlighting its many fascinating features. Wednesdays and Saturdays are our Primary Pilgrimage Programme days. This year will also see the publication of a new History of our Church, and the many prominent Catholics who have worshipped, lived, or visited here.

In this **Year of the Eucharist** we're also presenting Musical Oratory, restarting our Monthly Concerts, planning *Quarant'ore* (the 40 Hours Devotion), Night Fever, and other events.

The Oratory Shop has expanded its stock with hand-made rosaries by our Dominican neighbours in the New Forest, their lovely greeting cards, some distinctive Oratorian items, and unique gifts. We're aiming to source monastic products from Religious Houses on the Continent, and some local goods, all at very competitive prices.

The Catholic Truth Society (CTS) displays are being restocked for the end of lock-down with a wide variety of evangelizing and informative books, located near the Chapel of Our Lady of Fatima, and re-sited Divine Mercy image.

The Chapel of Saint Philip Neri and the Oratorian Saints has met with great acclaim, with the painting of S Philip now enshrined above the altar, and S John Henry Newman with his own *pri-dieu*. S Margaret Mary and S Claude's re-sited Shrines look beautiful in their more prominent positions.

The Confessionals are back in use - to the relief of many Parishioners and other Penitents who come from far and wide to make their Confession here. They have been restored in accord with Canon Law, and health and safety. Please ensure that you sanitize your hands before entering, and on leaving.

SHRINES in the SHRINE CHURCH

Every Oratory has a Chapel dedicated to our Founder, S Philip Neri. Since Bishop Philip's invitation to the Oratory to come to Bournemouth the chapel at the left-hand side of the Church has been destined for this purpose. The ideal time to effect this rearrangement came as we began to emerge from lock-down on 17 May, and in preparation for being designated as a Shrine Church for this Year of the Eucharist.

S Margaret Mary Alacoque, and her Jesuit Confessor, S Claude La Colombière (until recently housed in the side chapel) now have greater prominence enshrined on either side of the altar of Our Lady of Sorrows, mirroring the similar shrine of S Thérèse of Lisieux on the opposite side of the Church. Many favourable comments have already been received for this move.

The existing painting of S Philip has moved from the back of the side chapel to above the altar, and the picture of S John Henry Newman (first displayed here during his Canonisation) is now also there, where depictions of our other Oratorian Saints will join them a little later. A restored Crucifix complements the existing altar candlesticks, and a larger votive candle stand is more accessible outside the Chapel, now giving sufficient space for Mass to be offered at S Philip's altar.

The Divine Mercy has also moved to a more accessible location near the Fatima Chapel

Brothers of the Secular Oratory resume their 6pm regular 2nd & 4th Friday meetings from 25th June, and welcome men who wish to develop their spiritual life in the spirit of S Philip and the Oratory. Do join us!

AS OUR PARISH RETURNS TO FULL LIFE you are invited to take your part. *If everyone does something, then a few people don't have to do everything.* Please think and pray about how you might be involved, what God may be asking of you, what are the needs of our parish family... Here are a few examples:

Reading at Mass: If you can read clearly and prayerfully, you could be on our Readers' Rota - at one of the Sunday Masses, just once a month, or on the weekday rota (7.30am or 12.15pm once a week, or alternate weeks).

Sing in our Schola (the liturgical choir) at the 10.30am Solemn Mass. You don't have to be able to read music (or sight-read) but it helps. There's a simple audition - to ensure that applicants can sing in tune, and have some sense of timing - and then a Probationary Pathway.

Bell ringers ring our peal of 6 bells before the Sunday Solemn Mass and on other notable occasions, and practice on Monday evenings. Courses of training are given for every age. We have Ringers who are not yet teenagers, and senior citizens.

The Cleaning Team invites you to join them in keeping our beautiful Church clean and tidy on Thursday mornings.

Flower Arrangers are needed to swell our band of two!

Launderers wash and iron the Sacristy laundry - never too much at any one time, and never too frequent.

Collection Counters give a couple of hours on our monthly rota at mutually convenient times.

The Hospitality Team arrange social events, cater for our parish celebratory occasions, and much more.

Catechists: If you would like to be considered for training to assist with our Baptism Preparation Class for Parents & Godparents), or First Holy Communion programme (for young children), or the Confirmation course (for teenagers), or for adult Faith formation, please talk to one of the Fathers of Brothers.

Students and young people (aged approx. 18-35) meet on Sundays at 6pm Benediction, and then afterwards for formation, pizza and wine - growing in Faith and building good Catholic friendships.

Our Parish Office needs volunteers who are reliable and organised to assist with the many daily tasks under the guidance of our Administrative Manager.

The Oratory Bookshop welcomes volunteers to serve our customers after the Sunday Masses, and on some Wednesdays and Saturdays when we expect groups of Pilgrims to our Eucharistic Shrine Church during this Year.

The Parish Finance & Fabric Committee is seeking Parishioners with experience in either of these areas.

The Redevelopment Advisory Group (RAG) is coming together again as Phase 2 of our Redevelopment Plan gets under way. We need people with experience in building, surveying, electrical & mechanical engineering, finance, fund-raising, advertising, etc etc etc.
