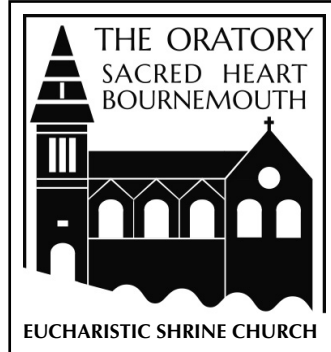
**OUR BISHOP CALLS EVERYONE BACK TO SUNDAY MASS** in his recent Message to the Diocese of Portsmouth (see page 3 of this Newsletter) with his clarion call: **“Now is the time to come back to the Lord to be nourished by His Word and Sacraments! Now is the time for everyone to return to Church.”**

**BISHOP PHILIP’S PASTORAL LETTER**, for the Feast of Corpus Christi, with its rich Eucharistic teaching, continues as the basis of the Sunday homily. During most of August the Sunday Gospel is S John chapter six which provides for deeper consideration of the Eucharist.

**THE YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST** in our Diocese follows from the international Year of the Word, draws us all back to Holy Mass, counteracts the lack of belief in the Real Presence, deepens our understanding, appreciation and devotion to Jesus in the Mass, and empowers us to be witnesses to the truth of Christ’s Eucharistic Presence, thereby *bringing people closer to Jesus Christ through His Church*.

**ORATORY is a EUCHARISTIC SHRINE CHURCH** designated by Bishop Philip for this Year of the Eucharist, welcoming parishes, groups and individuals coming on Pilgrimage and to gain the Plenary Indulgence.

**The International Exhibition of world-wide Eucharistic Miracles**, and our new mini-guide to the Oratory Church, are offered to enhance the experience for our many visitors and pilgrims.



**THINKING ABOUT BECOMING A CATHOLIC**, or just wanting to explore what the Catholic Church believes and teaches? (Or if you are an adult Catholic who missed out on the Sacrament of Confirmation.) It’s not too late to join the recently-started programme each Wednesday at 7.30pm. Please email the Parish Office early in August to request an invitation. The *Evangelium* programme expounds the teaching of the Catechism of the Catholic Church through the medium of Christian art, and clear definitions.

# YEAR OF THE EUCHARIST

## Message to the Diocese from the Bishop



Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

On 19th July, the Government relaxed many of the restrictions it put in place because of the pandemic. Even so, the virus continues to be present, and as a Diocese, we will need to continue creating safe environments in our parish churches and properties, so that everyone, particularly the elderly and the vulnerable, can visit church, participate in Mass and share in parish life, safely and with confidence.

The noble mission of our Diocese is: *Bringing People Closer to Jesus Christ through His Church*. It is in our churches that the Lord unites us together, sanctifies, teaches and guides us, and feeds us with the Sacraments of eternal life, sending us out on mission and service. During the lockdowns, many have followed Mass online and we thank God for all who helped to make that possible. But online is not the same as 'inline.' It's not the same as being there, as actually receiving Jesus in Holy Communion. It's not the same as sharing with our brothers and sisters in the life and mission of the eucharistic community.

This is why **I wish to say to everyone: Now is the time to come back to the Lord to be nourished by His Word and Sacraments! Now is the time for everyone to return to church.** The Lord is calling to us in our hearts: "The sheep that belong to me listen to my voice" (John 10: 27). He promises: "Anyone who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I in him" (John 6: 56). He says: "I have come that they may have life and have it to the full" (John 10: 10). As Catholics, we do not follow Christ Jesus simply out of habit or obligation. We follow him because we love him. We follow him because he calls us. We follow him because he is our Saviour: He laid down His life for us. **So I now say to you and to all: Come back to the Lord in Sunday Mass.** Come to be nourished by his Word and his Sacraments!

Thank you for reading this – and please be assured of my prayers.

## Granting of Plenary Indulgence

In order to celebrate with dignity the Year of the Eucharist, by mandate of the Right Reverend Philip Egan, Bishop of Portsmouth, a Plenary Indulgence is granted, from 6th June 2021 until 24th December 2022. The Plenary Indulgence is granted:

a) To any member of the Faithful who visits any of the Shrine Churches, namely St John's Cathedral (Portsmouth), **Sacred Heart (Bournemouth)**, St James Church (Reading), St Joseph's Church (Guernsey), and St Thomas Church (Jersey) on pilgrimage, and who devoutly participates in prayer of adoration in honour of the Holy Eucharist for at least 15 minutes, and prays the 'Our Father', and recites the Symbol of the Faith (the Creed).

b) To the Faithful who, due to their age, illness, or other serious cause, are hindered from moving, if repented of all their sins, and with the firm intention to carry out as soon as it will be possible for them, the three conditions indicated below, in front of a small image of either the Holy Eucharist, or of Our Lord and Saviour, joining spiritually those who have undertaken to go on pilgrimage to a Shrine Church, offering with confidence to the merciful God through Mary their prayers and pains, or the sacrifice of their own life.

In order to obtain the Plenary Indulgence, the faithful who are truly repentant and filled with charity must fulfil the following ritual conditions: Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the Holy Father's intentions.

**The Newman Certificate 'Reasons for Faith'** is a one year course exploring every aspect of our Catholic Faith to inform and enlighten participants, and enable you to explain and evangelize your family and friends.

A new 2nd year (bringing this up to diploma level) has been introduced to delve "deeper into Scripture", while the two year diploma in Spiritual Formation equips us to understand and develop our spiritual lives, and deepen our prayer.

The Academy is an Oratory apostolate which we believe to be the only distinctly Catholic institute to provide, not only clear teaching from S Thomas Aquinas, S John Henry Cardinal Newman and others, real time interactive engagement with our lecturers and international students, ample time for personal questions and clarification, extensive and comprehensive notes tailored to each session, but also personal access to the lecturers by Zoom, 'phone or email. **RE-ENVISIONING OUR REDEVELOPMENT** with ongoing discussions in our Parish Finance & Fabric Committee, and with the Diocesan Trustees. Scaffolding last month indicated vital repairs to roof leaks, paid for by a successful grant-funding application.

Other applications are in preparation for accessibility, to replace the steep stone steps from Richmond Hill into our Catholic Institute Halls with an accessible slope from a new entrance through the wall in Post Office Road, and then raising the internal levels to obliterate the many steps up and down for a complete interior flat floor throughout.

Thank you to everyone who completed the recent surveys.

The restaurant / trattoria is still part of the plan. We are working with local charities to provide counselling rooms for local people in need. The Parish Office and Oratory Shop will be more prominently sited across the width of the large hall, beneath the Richmond Hill wide windows. Sound-proofing between the Church and halls is also vital.

**HOPE FOR FOOD** - boxes beneath the freebie table at the back of church are for us all to donate suitable food for the homeless. Please help us support those most in need.

**PASTORAL VISITS and the SACRAMENTS:** Please let us know (via the Parish Office) of those who need the Sacraments of Anointing the Sick / Confession or Holy Communion at home or in residential homes.

**THE TRADITIONAL LATIN MASS** (Extraordinary Form 1962) continues as usual at 6pm on the First Fridays and on the Eve of Holy Days, by permission of our Bishop.

## ORATORY HOUSE GUESTS

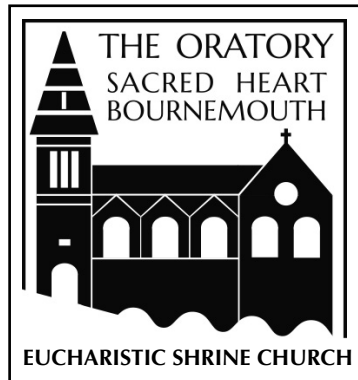
