Dear Friends,

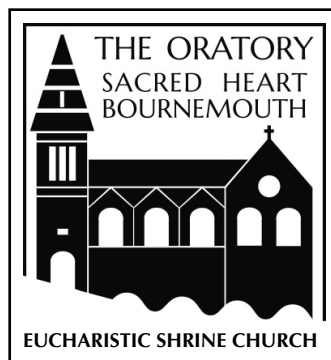
SEPTEMBER is the month when everything starts up again - schools, parish life, opportunities for our spiritual growth, and growing in our Faith.

We already have fourteen people (more than ever before) registered on our adult faith formation course - eager to become Catholics, or exploring the Faith, or for adult Confirmation preparation. Welcome to the journey in Faith! It's not too late to register for RCIA but please do so before 20th September.

Welcome to the many **Pilgrims** coming to our Eucharistic Shrine Church, designated by Bishop Philip for this diocesan Year of the Eucharist.

Many are also expressing great interest in our **International Exhibition of Eucharistic Miracles** and realising that it takes three or four visits to do it justice as there are over 40 posters to digest. This is a great boost to Faith in the Real Presence and to the power of Jesus shown in the Eucharist.



In the Oratory Community **Brother Francisco** continues his studies for the Priesthood (after two years philosophy at Oxford) he begins this month at the Westminster Seminary, Allen Hall, for three years theology and pastoralia etc. He'll be away most weeks, Monday-Friday, and back with us at weekends.

AS OUR PARISH RETURNS TO FULL LIFE you are invited to play your part.

Think and pray about how you might be involved, and what God may be asking of you.

Here are a few examples:

Reading at Mass: If you can read clearly and prayerfully, you could be on our Readers' Rota - at one of the Sunday Masses, just once a month, or on the weekday rota (7.30am or 12.15pm once a week, or alternate weeks). See Fr Peter.

Sing in our Schola (the liturgical choir) at the 10.30am Solemn Mass. You don't have to be able to read music (or sight-read) but it helps. There's a simple audition - to ensure that applicants can sing in tune, and have a sense of timing - and then a Probationary Pathway. Talk to: Director of Music: Andrew Santos, Oratory Organist: Peter Murdock-Saint, or Schola Librarian: Sue Sims.

Bell ringers ring our peal of 6 bells before the Sunday Solemn Mass and on other notable occasions, and practice on Monday evenings. Courses of training are given for every age. We have Ringers who are pre-teens and senior citizens. Talk to Tower Captain Kim Matthews.

The Cleaning Team invites you to join them in keeping our beautiful Church clean and tidy for 1 or 2 hours on Thursday mornings.

Flower Arrangers are needed to swell our band of two! Carol will welcome you.

Launderers wash and iron the Sacristy laundry - never too much at any one time. See Br Francisco (Oratory Sacristan).

The Hospitality Team serve coffee and cake on Sundays, arrange social events, and cater for our parish celebratory occasions. Talk to Louise in the Office.

Catechists: If you would like to be considered for training to assist with our Baptism Preparation Class (for Parents & Godparents), or First Holy Communion programme (for young children), or the Confirmation course (for teenagers), or for adult Faith formation, please talk to Fr Peter or Fr Andrew.

Students and young people (aged aprox. 18-35) meet on Sundays at 6pm Benediction, and then afterwards for formation, pizza and wine - growing in Faith and building good Catholic friendships. Fr Andrew is the University Catholic Chaplain.

The Oratory Shop welcomes volunteers to serve our customers after the Sunday Masses, and on some Wednesdays and Saturdays when we welcome groups of Pilgrims to our Eucharistic Shrine Church. Shop Manager: Ann Cowan.

Our Parish Office needs volunteers who are reliable and organised (2 hours per week or fortnight) to assist with many tasks under the guidance of our Administrative Manager, Louise Farah.

The Oratory Sewing Circle seeks nimble fingers with sewing experience for regular social and practical sessions to repair sacred vestments and other church items and enhance our skills. Teaching and guidance are given. Contact Susan Cowan via the Parish Office.
