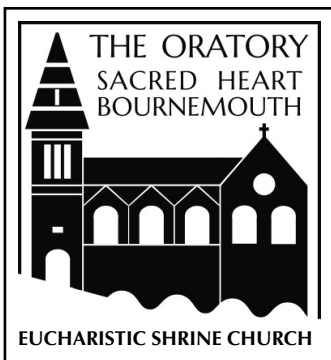
Dear Friends,

OCTOBER is the month of the Holy Rosary on which Bishop Philip writes:

October is traditionally the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. The Rosary developed in the High Middle Ages, and the reason that October came to be devoted to its recitation is primarily because the liturgical feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated annually on 7th October.

The Rosary is a wonderful prayer for us to say, praying to Our Lord for protection from all danger, sickness and evil. If you need help in saying the Rosary, [click here](#) for a simple explanation. I'd like to encourage you to say the Rosary each day this month. I have a CD in my car, and I often pray the Rosary while driving. There are many intentions this month, especially during this Season of Creation as the world prepares for the COP26 summit. Another intention is the defeat of Baroness Meacher's 'Assisted Dying Bill 2021' which comes before the House of Lords for its second reading and debate on Friday 15th October. May Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, pray for us.

The Rosary is recited daily in the Oratory immediately after the 12.15pm Mass. On the first Saturday of each month the intentions are Pro-Life. Come and join us in the Lady Chapel during this Month of the Holy Rosary.

OUR ORATORIAN SEMINARIAN writes:

During my studies at Blackfriars in Oxford, it became painfully clear to me, that all the philosophy-genes in my branch of the family tree most definitely went to Jaakko Hintikka, the famous and world-renowned Finnish philosopher, and I only managed to scrape through the two years of philosophy, which felt as long as the seven years of famine, with the help of Dr Andrew Beards and the inherent Finnish stubbornness. I am now hoping to find some long lost theology-gene stored away somewhere in the deep recesses of the heart of my soul. My maternal great-grandfather was a Lutheran preacher-man, so there may be some hope for me too, but then again my maternal grandfather was a raving alcoholic. Fortunately my conversion flushed all those genes out of my system eleven years ago.

The three years of theology (one year's parish placement is excluded, as the Bournemouth Oratory is my parish placement for life), will take place at Allen Hall in the London Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. If you have to go to London, you might as well go to Chelsea. Cardinal Allen founded the seminary in 1568 at Douai in France, because at that time being a Catholic priest or seminarian in this country was punishable by death. Over 150 priests who came from Douai to England were cruelly martyred. The French Revolution made it equally dangerous for the seminarians to stay in France, and Allen Hall moved to Ware in Hertfordshire, and finally to London in 1975, to provide a much wider variety of pastoral experiences for the students. The seminary is on the estate that once belonged to St Thomas More, and in the large garden (by London standards), one of the mulberry trees he himself planted, is still growing and bearing fruit. The house itself has an interesting history, and before it became a seminary, Sisters of Adoration had their convent there. The main chapel was destroyed in the Blitz, and the present one was completed in the late 50's, and it is a true child of its time with a 80's facelift. Only bright green, orange and brown mosaics are missing.

As St John's Seminary at Womersley has now been closed, Allen Hall is completely full, and alongside with great variety of men with different ages, backgrounds and nationalities, my studies during this term will comprise of Joannine writings, St Paul and the Epistles of the New Testament, Scripture, Liturgy and Sacraments, Patristics and Church history. I also have both voice and singing lessons, and having studied two years of Latin, which turned out to be all Greek to me, I am now starting the studies of Greek, which may well turn out to be all Latin, so it will be all right in the end.

I want to thank all the people who have supported me in many various ways thus far, and I ask you to continue to pray for me, and with the arms of prayer I shall embrace you all. Allen Hall may not produce any more martyrs, only time will tell, but the Most Precious Blood of Christ shed at Calvary for the whole mankind, calls us all to become martyrs of love, which requires a complete self-surrender to God with the help of Our Lady, our guardian angels and patron saints. In the words of St Philip Neri: *'Let us throw ourselves into the arms of God, and be sure that if He wishes anything of us, He will make us good for all He desires us to do for Him.'*

CORONA VIRUS GUIDELINES

Bishop Philip has had a couple of queries about the latest guidance on coronavirus-related restrictions.

The Government guidance published on 16th July 2021 relating to places of worship includes the following:

- There are no longer limits on the number of people meeting. Thus there are no restrictions on group sizes for attending communal worship.
- Legal requirements for social distancing no longer apply and there is no need to stay 2 metres apart from people who do not live together.
- There are no legal restrictions on the number of people that can attend a place of worship, including at significant life events such as baptisms.
- Face coverings are no longer required by law in any setting. However, the Government recommends that people wear face coverings in crowded areas, such as on public transport.
- There are no longer limits on the number of people who can sing indoors or outdoors. This includes congregational and communal singing.

However, there are steps that the Government asks everyone to consider in order to reduce risk of transmission, such as:

- Cleaning surfaces that people touch regularly and good hygiene.
- Identifying poorly ventilated areas and taking steps to improve air flow.
- Ensuring those who are unwell do not attend.
- Communicating to everyone the measures put in place.

Needless to say, our Parish complies with all of the above, and more.

Our health and safety risk assessments ensure that we are "fit for purpose" as we take very seriously the health and well-being of everyone who comes here.

THE ORATORY SHOP (see opening times half way down the right hand box) has a constant supply of new stock including the new **Daily Missal (£7.95) for 2022 starting Advent (ie. 28th November 2021)**, distinctly Catholic Christmas cards, Advent calendars, Rosaries (hand-made by the Dominican Sisters in the New Forest), beautifully framed art pictures of Our Lady and Saints (only £12 - £15 each), unique cards and other Oratorian items, votive lamps and candles (but not for use in our Church), Christmas Cribs, prayer books, books about our Catholic Faith, the Saints, and much more.

VOLUNTEERS are still needed for a wide variety of interesting roles from half-an-hour on Monday mornings, to assisting in the Oratory Shop, or the Office, Reading at Mass, Welcoming at Sunday Mass - all on a weekly or monthly rota. Please offer to help to get our parish back up and running after the pandemic.
