LENT BEGINS THIS MONTH with Ash Wednesday on the 2nd March. What's on in Lent, here at the Oratory, is listed on page 4 of this Newsletter, and page 3 gives details of this year's Lenten Charity Projects for Ukraine.

As our Parish Family communal Lenten Exercise we all seek to be at one mid-week Mass in each of the six weeks of Lent, and / or Stations of the Cross on Lenten Fridays, and/or Eucharistic Adoration on Wednesdays or Saturdays.

Metropolitan Archbishop Mieczyslaw Mokrzycki of Lviv, says: “We are ready to welcome people into our churches and provide them with food and water. We have organised first-aid courses for priests, religious and laity, so that they can give emergency care for the wounded.” The archbishop added that some Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) had arrived in western Ukraine and “we have already rented some empty houses to provide accommodation for them”.

Some 1.5 million IDPs fled Crimea and parts of the Donbas in 2014 in response to military action by separatists supported by Russian forces. Despite the tense situation, the archbishop said: “War does not bring any solutions, only destruction, suffering and lack of peace.” He said he was profoundly moved by the level of international solidarity with Ukraine. Archbishop Mokrzycki added: “We are most grateful to the entire Church, and to Pope Francis, who has issued a worldwide appeal for prayer for Ukraine.”

Fasting and Abstinence during Lent

Confusion or uncertainty about the Church’s teaching on these topics is simply addressed here so that we can be clear as we begin together the journey of Lent.

Ash Wednesday (2nd March) and Good Friday (15th April) are the only two remaining Days of both Fasting and Abstinence.

All Fridays throughout the year (unless they are Solemnities) are Days of Abstinence.

All Christians are encouraged to fast on these and other occasions - except on Sundays (the weekly Easter) and Solemnities, which are joyful, when it is inappropriate to fast.

FASTING refers to how much food we eat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday only one average-sized meal may be eaten, and two smaller snacks (called collations) that do not equal the normal meal. The collations are optional, not required. Eating between meals is prohibited, but non-alcoholic drinks are allowed.

The Church’s current 1983 Code of Canon Law binds all Catholics aged 14 or older to fast on these two days of the year, until beginning their 60th. In the previous Code of Canon Law (1917) abstinence began at age 7. Since it is valuable to teach children the importance of fasting, it is good for them to do this even before required to do so.

ABSTINENCE refers to abstaining from eating meat. Meat refers to the flesh-meat of mammals or fowl. Beef, poultry, lamb, etc are all forbidden on days of abstinence. Abstinence does not currently prohibit animal by-products like dairy (eg. cheese, butter, milk, or eggs), but these were formerly prohibited. Fish is permitted along with shellfish and other cold-blooded animals like alligators.

ACTION FOR LENT ~ from recent Sunday homilies:

Pride and arrogance are not attractive qualities, especially not to God. A practical way to humble our pride is to school ourselves to avoid the personal pronouns: “**I, me, and my...**” As a Lenten exercise, we could start with our out-going emails, before pressing <Send>, when checking for typos, to expunge all (or most) of these personal pronouns. This prepares the way for doing the same in our daily speech.

An evening at the Oratory with the highlights of Stainer's "Crucifixion" interspersed with appropriate Readings and Prayer, concluding with Benediction.

Musical Oratories, and restoration of our Monthly Concerts, are planned during the year.

An informative, devotional and popular presentation of this engaging question helps us to participate in Passion-tide, and prepare for Holy Week.
