RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

The Sunday Mass Obligation was restored at Advent (November 2021) so most people are now back at Mass, and we seem to have more young people and young families than pre-Covid. Recent returnees may be unaware or forgetful of what is required, and of good practice.

Masks are no longer required, but if a Communicant chooses to wear a mask, and attempts to receive Holy Communion on the hand, this is a practical impossibility, and subject to accident. The mask must first be removed (or at least lowered) before approaching.

The Indult (ie. a concession, under certain conditions, permitting an act that the universal law of the Church does not sanction) permitting receiving Communion in the hand (as an exception from the universal norm of receiving Communion directly on the tongue) must be carried out in the acceptable manner to avoid sacrilege or accident.

Therefore: Both hands must always be free for the act of Communion on the hand. ie. One hand “makes a throne” for the other hand. The Sacred Host is placed on the upper hand, and then, the lower hand reverently picks up the Host to convey It to the mouth.

The Communicant’s two hands must be unimpeded. If they are holding a child, or walking-stick, or anything else (or wearing gloves), the Sacred Host may NOT be put in the hand, but must be given directly into the mouth, never onto a proffered single hand.

These scenarios lack both due reverence, and proper control, endangering the Host slipping from the hand, or being dropped.

The Church directs that the Sacred Host must be consumed “in front of the Minister” to ensure that no one walks away with the Host to avoid:

- Hosts being dropped or knocked from the hand at the time of Communion.
- Dropped on the floor elsewhere in the Church, by accident, or by persons who do not know what to do with a Host.
- Discarded (as above) outside the Church.

All of the above have happened here (as elsewhere) and are sacrilegious.

- Additionally we have to guard against Hosts being secreted and taken away for occult purposes.

Only a Baptized Catholic (or one who has been formally Received into the Catholic Church) may receive Holy Communion in a Catholic Church. Members of other Ecclesial Communities may request a blessing by crossing their arms over their chest, or remain in their seats.

The universal norm for receiving Holy Communion is to do so kneeling and on the tongue which avoids such danger of sacrilege or accidents.
