## MAY IS THE MONTH MARY and OF THE HOLY ROSARY

**OUR MAY DEVOTION** began on Rosary Sunday (1 May), continued with last Sunday's Crowning of Our Lady, then this Saturday's Marian street procession (at the end of the 5pm Saturday Vigil Mass) with our Portuguese, Spanish, Brazilian and Filipino Catholic communities, and includes the thrice daily singing of the *Regina Caeli* (for which music cards are available), and daily praying of the Rosary.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

### **First Reading**

Acts 14: 21-27

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how He had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new.'

**and His kingdom will have no end.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,**  
**who proceeds from the Father and the Son,**  
**who with the Father and the Son is adored and**  
**glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.**

**I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.**  
**I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins**  
**and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead**  
**and the life of the world to come. Amen.**
