Dear Friends,

SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION RESTORED FROM LAST MONTH:

The bishops of England and Wales have reinstated the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days from Sunday 5 June, the feast of Pentecost, (previously proposed from Advent 2021). They write specifically:

“The days on which all Catholics in England and Wales must attend Mass (unless legitimately impeded) are: every Sunday; the Nativity of the Lord (25 December); the Epiphany of the Lord (6 January); the Ascension of the Lord (Thursday after 6th Sunday of Easter); Saints Peter & Paul (29 June); the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (15 August); All Saints (1 November).” Their full statement is on page 3 of our June Newsletter (read via our website).

If we miss Mass on a Sunday or Day of Obligation (a mortal sin) we should not present ourselves for Holy Communion without first going to Confession.

SACRILEGE - treating something which is sacred, in a profane way
- thereby offending Almighty God, and those devoted to Him -
is seriously sinful, and deeply affects the person behaving in this way.

We are sad to report that there have been a number of recent cases in our church
of desecration of the Eucharistic Species either in ignorance or serious intent.
Sacred Hosts have been found by our Sacristan and Cleaners beneath benches;
on more than one occasion someone receiving into the hand has then closed
their hand into a fist, thus crushing the Sacred Host; one man secreted a Host,
carried it outside, and was waving it aggressively at Parishioners, before
eventually consuming it.

Please be vigilant (while not disturbing your own devotion). If you see
someone behaving strangely at the Communion rail please alert one of the
Fathers or Brothers, or a Welcomer, but do not confront them yourself.

“The Communion plate for the Communion of the faithful” - mandated by the
current General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM 118) - and our careful
vigilance, try to avoid such dangers of profanation, which may nevertheless
occur by those who are determined, and visitors who do not know what to do
with the Host, and are at a loss.

If you bring to Mass guests who are not Catholic, or Catholics out-of-practice
with their Faith, it is a kindness to explain that they are NOT to receive Holy
Communion, but may best remain in their seat or, if seeking a blessing, cross
their arms over their chest as the usual sign for this.

If you are holding a walking stick, small child, or present only one (or a
gloved) hand, or are so encumbered as to endanger the Host being dropped,
then Communion can be given only on the tongue - which is the universal
norm, and by far the safest practice to avoid danger or sacrilege.

Please seriously consider how you yourself receive the Sacred Host . . .

THE ROSARY is prayed in the Lady Chapel after the daily 12.15pm Mass,
and on Wednesdays at 6.30pm at the Cenotaph / War Memorial. Do join us.

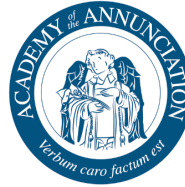
