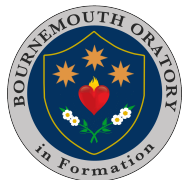

**Organ prelude** Widor: from Symphony I No. 4 Adagio.

## THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

### First Reading

Leviticus 13: 1-2, 44-46

The Lord said to Moses and Aaron, 'If a swelling or scab  
or shiny spot appears on a man's skin, a case of leprosy of  
the skin is to be suspected. The man must be taken to  
Aaron, the priest, or to one of the priests who are his sons.  
'The man is leprous: he is unclean. The priest must  
declare him unclean; he is suffering from leprosy of the  
head. A man infected with leprosy must wear his clothing  
torn and his hair disordered; he must shield his upper lip  
and cry, "Unclean, unclean." As long as the disease lasts  
he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart: he  
must live outside the camp.'

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

### Psalm (31)

**You are my refuge, O Lord;**  
**You fill me with the joy of salvation.**

Happy the man whose offence is forgiven,  
whose sin is remitted.

O happy the man to whom the Lord imputes no guilt,  
in whose spirit is no guile.

But now I have acknowledged my sins;  
my guilt I did not hide.

I said: 'I will confess my offence to the Lord.'

And You, Lord, have forgiven the guilt of my sin.

**Second Reading**

I Corinthians 10: 31 - 11: 1

Whatever you eat, whatever you drink, whatever you do at all, do it for the glory of God. Never do anything offensive to anyone – to Jews or Greeks or to the Church of God; just as I try to be helpful to everyone at all times, not anxious for my own advantage but for the advantage of everybody else, so that they may be saved. Take me for your model, as I take Christ.

The Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

**Alleluia!** May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ enlighten the eyes of our mind, so that we can see what hope His call holds for us. Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to *N.*  
**Glory to You, O Lord.**

**Gospel**

Mark 1: 40-45

A leper came to Jesus and pleaded on his knees: 'If You want to' he said 'You can cure me.' Feeling sorry for him, Jesus stretched out His hand and touched him. 'Of course I want to!' He said. 'Be cured!' And the leprosy left him at once and he was cured. Jesus immediately sent him away and sternly ordered him, 'Mind you say nothing to anyone, but go and show yourself to the priest, and make the offering for your healing prescribed by Moses as evidence of your recovery.' The man went away, but then started talking about it freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to Him.

The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to You, Lord Jesus Christ.**
