LENT 2024 at the ORATORY

Come to an extra Mass - once a week (or more):

12.15pm daily, Monday - Saturday,
also 7.30am Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.

Come to Confession more regularly:

One of the Fathers is in the Confessional before every Mass, every day.

Come to Holy Hour - Eucharistic Adoration (or just half-an-hour):

11am - 12 noon every Wednesday and Saturday.

Come to Stations of the Cross - twice every Friday during Lent:

11.30am (before the 12.15pm Mass), and again at 6pm.

Come to Evening Oratory at 6pm daily (Mondays-Thursdays):

starts with the 6pm Angelus, then 20 minutes silent prayer,
followed by the Oratory Exercises of a Litany, Marian anthem,
Oratory prayers, and Intercessions. Ends about 6.35pm.

Come to Coffee and *conversazione* after the 10.30 Sunday Mass to meet new Catholic friends, and build up the Parish family.

Come to our monthly lunch and social afternoon

1pm on the 3rd Thursday of every month (hosted by our SVP).

Our Bishop's SIX HOLY HABITS are ideal for the 40 days of Lent:

- to keep Sunday special, a family day, by attending Mass,
- to spend 5 minutes a day in prayer using the Scriptures,
- to do penance on Fridays (abstinence from meat) & serve the poor & needy.
- every fortnight to make a Holy Half Hour before the Blessed Sacrament,
- to go to Confession once a month, and
- to join a small group for formation, prayer, and fellowship.

**Homily preached at the First Mass of Father Francisco Hintikka on Thursday 25th January 2024
by Father John Saward, Parish Priest of Ss Gregory & Augustine, Oxford**

The words of St Paul: *By the grace of God I am what I am*. The conversion of St Paul was a *miracle of grace*. Against all expectation, to the astonishment of Jews and Christians, the persecutor of Christ and His Church was transformed into the Apostle of Christ. The man who had insulted the Lord Jesus became, by God's grace, the bold preacher of the Lord Jesus. This conversion of Saul into Paul was accomplished not by earthly influence, but by heavenly intervention: the risen and ascended Christ appeared to him on the Damascus Road and told him, as he lay prostrate in the dust, 'I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting'. St Paul forever after knew himself to be loved by Jesus: 'The life I now live in the flesh [he said] I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself up for me'. He had no scrupulous fears, yet he never lost his sorrow for his sins, indeed confessed himself to be the greatest of all sinners: 'I am the least of the Apostles, [he said] unfit to be called an Apostle, because I persecuted the Church of God'. But, as he shows us in his Epistles, he recognized that his testimony to his transformation by the grace of Jesus would, to the end of the world, renew the hope of fearful souls, and so, in grateful love of the Lord, he told the Corinthians, *By the grace of God I am what I am*.

The conversion of St Paul was a miracle of grace, and so, in a certain way, is the priestly vocation of Father Francisco. As we heard last night, he is only the eleventh native Finn to be ordained as a Catholic priest in five hundred years. What a grace! Let us give thanks to the Lord our God! *Gratias agamus Domino Deo nostro! Kiittäkäämme Herraa, meidän Jumalaamme!* A vocation is not a natural ambition, but a supernatural *gift*, a grace, flowing from the Heart of the Divine Saviour. It is Christ our Lord who, through His Church, calls men to be His priests. What He tells the Twelve in the Upper Room applies also to Fr Francisco, and to me and every priest: 'You did not choose me; I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit.' A vocation may come as a very great surprise. In Caravaggio's painting of the call of St Matthew we see our Lord with kingly authority pointing to the old tax collector, seated at a table with his coins and his unsavoury companions. Matthew points a finger at himself, as if to say to our Lord, 'What, *me?*' St Bede tells us that Jesus' choosing of Matthew was an act of mercy: *miserando atque eligendo*. St Matthew, like St Paul, can say, and Father Francisco and I and every priest can say: *By the grace of God, by the mercy of God, I was called to be what I now am*.

Priestly Ordination is not, strictly speaking, a *miracle of grace*, but it is a *communication* of supernatural gifts, a Sacrament instituted by Christ the Priest at the Last Supper. Now there are two effects of what the Holy Spirit through the bishop does to a man's soul at his Ordination. First, He imprints an indestructible mark (or character) upon his soul, shaping him forever into the likeness of Christ the Priest. The priest thus becomes, in the words of St John Paul II, 'a living and transparent image of Christ the Priest'. In this character, this *objective* likeness to Christ, lies the power, not given to the angels, of consecrating the Body and Blood of Christ. When he pronounces the words of consecration, the priest acts and speaks in the person of Christ, and through him, as by an instrument, Christ the Priest changes the whole substance of bread into His true Body born of the Virgin Mary and the whole substance of wine into His Precious Blood shed for poor sinners on the Cross. *By a supernatural gift of God, by the sacred character, the priest is what he is and does what he does*.

The second gift the Holy Spirit bestows on the ordinand's soul is the special *grace* of the priesthood. Now the supreme *act* of the priesthood is the offering of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Therefore, the grace of priesthood is above all given to enable the priest to offer the Holy Sacrifice worthily and so with *reverence*. *Reverence*: For Jesus, God the Son made true man, really present, offered, and received in the Holy Sacrament of the Altar. *Reverence*: Expressed *inwardly* in faith, in penitence and humility, and with the loving intention to offer oneself in union with the Divine Victim to the Father. *Reverence*: expressed *outwardly* in the ceremonial and all the sacred beauty of the Church's Holy Tradition. *Reverence* in the sanctuary: This is St Philip's and St John Henry Newman's great gift to the Church in the English-speaking world. The Oratories, including this hope-filled young Oratory in Bournemouth, take St Thomas Aquinas' command to heart: *Quantum potes, tantum aude, Dare* to do as much as you can to glorify our Divine and Eucharistic Lord. Do not underestimate the pastoral power of outward reverence and sacred beauty to enlighten, encourage, and save souls. As one of the greatest theologians of the twentieth century, Father Garrigou-Lagrange, says: 'Every Mass has an infinite value because of the principal Offerer and the Victim offered [Christ], but the faithful should be able to grasp this limitless worth of the Mass *from the way in which it is celebrated*.' Father Francisco: *By the grace of God, you are what you are*, a priest forever after the order of Melchizedek, a priest of our Lord Jesus Christ. *By the grace of God* bestowed upon you yesterday, offer every Mass of your life, for the glory of the Most Holy Trinity and the salvation of souls, with the loving devotion of this, your first Mass.

St Paul knew himself to be loved by the Son of God. On the Cross, through His vision of the Father, the incarnate Son saw Saul (Paul), loved him, willed his conversion, and gave Himself up for him. *The same is true for you, Father Francisco*. You, too, were in the mind and heart of Jesus Crucified. The grace of your conversion and the grace of your Ordination were merited by the shedding of His Precious Blood. He loves you! He loves you so much He has made you His priest. He loves you so much, Father Francisco Johannes, that He entrusted you on Calvary, with every other priest in the person of St John, to Mary, His Ever-Virgin Mother. *By the grace of God, you are what you are*, and that grace has passed into your soul from Jesus' Heart through our Lady's loving intercession. Stay close to her, and she, the Mother of Fairest Love, will keep you close to Jesus. She will ensure you never doubt the unfathomable love that Jesus, her Son and God, has for you. *By the grace of God, thanks to our Lady, you are what you are*.
