There's always something NEW going on at the Oratory...!

FISH FRIDAYS is a sociable, informal dinner, twice a month, normally on first and third Fridays. Arrivals are from 7.30pm - to encourage attendance at the 6pm first Friday monthly Latin Mass, or Evening Oratory.

Fish Fridays began at the end of Lent last year, initially with 5 or 6 people, soon 8-12, now two dozen or more. The host(s) cooks a fish-based or vegetarian meal (observing Friday abstinence from meat) for a minimum contribution of £5 per head (some give more); any excess is donated to the Redevelopment Fund.

Oratory Parishioners can bring a non-Catholic, as a way of introducing our Faith, and it's a great way for new people to meet, from different demographics, and forming strong bonds - "bringing people closer to Jesus Christ through His Church".

After the Good Friday Liturgy there was a Fish Fridays rosary walk, appropriate Scripture readings, and quiet meditative prayer, with a meal interpreted from the Last Supper including bean stew, simple grilled fish, and unleavened bread. This has led to a more structured prayer around the meal, including everyone's intentions, Scripture reading, and a 5-10 minute presentation about various topics (such as lives of Saints, pro-life awareness, and analysis of the Catechism), offered by different attendees each time. This ensures that the social event remains Christ-centred, and focused on faith formation. A participant reports: "There are so many new faces - both Catholic and non-Catholic - new bonds are being formed, and there are some amazing conversations and spiritual support between people". This entirely lay-led initiative is thus very Oratorian!

Fish Fridays will become *al fresco* during the summer, and then find a home in our new Café Neri. Numbers are currently limited by space, so apply early via the Parish Office to secure a seat for Friday 21st June (or for 5th or 19th July).

ORATORY YOUNG ADULTS (OYA) is our latest initiative for **all** 18-35 year olds (incorporating our University Cath. Soc. - but for all our young people) discussing questions that are important to us as young Catholics, reflecting on Scripture and catechetics, praying together, building a support network of good Catholic friends, and having fun. Sundays: 3.30pm Rosary, 4pm OYA, concluding with 6pm Benediction.

ORATORY POSTULANTS and NOVICES

Some of you have asked - so here's an answer to your question:
"What is the process for those who consider joining an Oratory?"

"**A Nibbler**" is the unofficial term for those who are enquiring (nibbling!) who must be in good physical and mental health, over 18, and normally under 45 years of age - older men are usually too set in their ways to be formed in the way of S Philip. Enquirers are normally known to the Fathers over some time, frequenting the Oratory, coming regularly to Confession, for Spiritual Direction, and will often be a Brother of the Secular Oratory. They will come to know our ways, and we to know them. Most importantly, they will have grown in love of S Philip, and his maxim: *Love to be unknown*.

If they enquire about a Vocation to the Oratory, they need the agreement of their Spiritual Director and will have an initial meeting with the Superior (Provost / Moderator). They may then be invited to lunch, then to stay as a Guest for a weekend, then for longer periods (totalling at least a month), and may then apply to be considered for the Postulancy. There needs to be a psychological assessment, and DBS safeguarding clearance. The Oratory vocation is based on stability. Like Benedictines we do not move from house to house, so need to ensure that the place and the Community are a good fit.

A Postulant lives in the Oratory House alongside the Fathers and Brothers, but almost anonymously, not named publicly (nor yet having decided upon a name). This avoids embarrassment (to the individual and to the Community) if they leave, which inevitably happens not frequently during this trial period of testing. They share in a limited way in our life, household chores, serving Mass, etc, while becoming familiar with the life of S Philip, the Constitutions which govern every Oratory, with the Particular Statutes, the Oratorian charism, traditions, and spiritual path. After a minimum of three months (but no more than a year) they may make formal application to be considered for the Novitiate, and are voted upon. They must be as it were "born for the Oratory" - difficult to define, but perfectly obvious to Oratorians.

The first that the Parish really knows of him is after his Clothing as a Novice when he first appears in the Oratorian Habit - which includes the distinctive collar, a simple fascia, and the Oratorian biretta. Oratorians do not take Vows (S Philip did not want us to be a Religious Order), but, on Clothing as a Novice, a promise is made to remain for life in this one House.

A Novice, as the name implies, is a "learner", whose primary purpose is to grow in holiness, in the way of S Philip, and that of the particular House. He needs to be prayerful, humble, persevering, not singular (i.e. not standing out from his Brethren). After First Probation (of a year or so), he must receive a majority vote to enter Second Probation and, if destined for the Priesthood, may then begin Seminary formation.

A Triennial will have received a positive vote at the end of the three year Novitiate, has a passive voice in deliberations, and may be elected or appointed to certain posts. **A Sextennial** has completed six years, is a full Member of the Community, and may be elected to senior positions.
