## **BOURNEMOUTH ORATORY**

### ***In Formation***

Lots of you have said how helpful you found last week's Newsletter article: ***What the Church teaches about Mass intentions***, and particularly why their announcement at Mass is discouraged. You can download last week's Newsletter from the parish website, or ask Sharon, in the Parish Office, to print the article for you. Thank you for the subsequent flurry of Mass intention envelopes. Help yourself to envelopes at the back of church.

Someone enquired last week (and said that a few others were asking) why the Gospel is sung at the 10:30am Solemn Mass. (1) We believe that we are continuing what we inherited, and (2) the Church has always encouraged this, especially at the Principal Mass on Sundays, even in the most modern edition of the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (2010 GIRM): "*Great importance should be attached to the use of singing in the celebration of the Mass... Every care should be taken that singing by the ministers and the people not be absent in celebrations that occur on Sundays and on Holydays of Obligation... Preference is to be given to those parts that are of greater importance.*" GIRM 40.

*"The Gospel constitutes the high point of the Liturgy of the Word. The Liturgy itself teaches the great reverence that is to be shown to this reading by setting it off from the other readings with special marks of honour."* GIRM 60. It is also liturgically illogical to sing the *Alleluia* – as it should be (GIRM 62) – and then to merely read Jesus' words in the Gospel for which the *Alleluia* is the prelude. St Augustine teaches (GIRM 39) that "Singing is for one who loves" and "Whoever sings prays twice".

St Augustine also said: "*Sing with your voice, sing with your life*". We not only sing the Gospel, but live the Gospel! As from this Thursday (13<sup>th</sup> July) we are hosting the "Hope 4 Food" Soup Kitchen here in the small hall of Sacred Heart's Catholic Institute on Tuesdays and Thursdays (6 – 7:30pm), feeding 70-90 homeless people in Bournemouth. This came about by a Parishioner showing Fr Peter last Friday's Bournemouth Echo article, and his offering our facilities to this excellent charity in need of a central venue. If you'd like to volunteer, please speak to one of the Fathers or Brothers, or to our own Michael Hughes.

You'll notice that the Oratory's Founder, St Philip Neri, now has his place in our church – at the entrance of the small side chapel on the left – and that Our Lady of

Perpetual Succour has returned to her original, more prominent place, between the main doors.

The electric votive candle stands (which may have seemed practical, but are unreal and unappealing) are being replaced with ordinary pricket stands for proper votive candles. These are low soot emission candles, especially developed for the requirements of the London Oratory, and thus ideal for us at Sacred Heart after the recent redecoration of our beautiful church. Hayes & Finch undertook months of research and testing and formulated a blend of fully refined paraffin wax and stearin, plus a percentage of wax additives, to achieve the required blend, and also modified the wick type to create the required low soot emission votive candle which they tested in their laboratory, and was independently tested for the London Oratory by Cambridge University. These more natural votive candles will attract greater use in our devotion to the Saints.

**The Fellowship Group** meets this Sunday after the 4pm Mass, as usual, (from 5pm until 5:50) and then continues after 6pm Oratory & Benediction. We're planning our programme for the new academic year, so come tonight to have your input, including involvement in the University Freshers' Fayre, getting fresh focus and direction in the spirit of the Oratory's St Philip Neri, and 40 days for Life.

**40 Days for Life** is a world-wide movement that has saved at least 13,300 lives, 154 abortion workers converted, and 86 abortion centres closed around the world. The Oratory Fathers have encouraged our Parish to sign-up to this autumn's campaign (27<sup>th</sup> September – 5<sup>th</sup> November) to save lives, inspire hearts, and change minds by prayer, fasting, community outreach, and peaceful vigils. To find out more or get involved, come next Sunday (16<sup>th</sup> July) to 6pm Oratory & Benediction, and then to the 6:30 meeting in the Padre Pio room.
