**Confessions** are 20 minutes before every Mass and on  
Wednesdays and Saturdays from 11am until 12 noon

The Government mandates face-coverings or masks must be worn in all public inside spaces, including places of worship, from this weekend. This means that we can reduce safe-distancing from 2metres to 1 metre and thus accommodate a few more people in the permitted restrictions.

The Sunday Mass Obligation is still suspended because of the virus, and safe-distancing limits the numbers who can be accommodated at Sunday Masses, but you could come to a less busy weekday Mass.

Holy Communion is distributed after Mass as the recommended option for increased safety and practical purposes as a temporary expediency.

Thank you to our team of 30 voluntary Stewards for keeping our Church open for Mass and visitors, and sanitizing after every Mass. Thank you to our Cantors, bell-ringers, S Vincent de Paul Society, and Office staff. Please volunteer to be a Steward (a 2 hour shift on your day of choice).

## Gospel

Matthew 14: 22-33

In the fourth watch of the night he went towards them, walking on the lake, and when the disciples saw him walking on the lake they were terrified. 'It is a ghost' they said, and cried out in fear. But at once Jesus called out to them, saying, 'Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid.' It was Peter who answered. 'Lord,' he said 'if it is you, tell me to come to you across the water.' 'Come' said Jesus. Then Peter got out of the boat and started walking towards Jesus across the water, but as soon as he felt the force of the wind, he took fright and began to sink. 'Lord! Save me!' he cried. Jesus put out his hand at once and held him. 'Man of little faith,' he said 'why did you doubt?' And as they got into the boat the wind dropped.
