Dear Friends,

“It’s like a Retreat” - some have said - which is a positive way of seeing the lock-down and using it to “be Saints in our own homes” - as S Philip Neri was constantly encouraging.

Let’s pray that we, and those around us, will not be too quick to loose the silence and peace which have been so refreshing, and to continue the good practices which we’ve begun in this privileged period when many have ‘attended’ Holy Mass more frequently than ever before, given more time to personal prayer, engaged in daily Bible reading, participated in study courses via virtual conferencing, and maintained regular contact with family and friends - not least with the Saints, our friends in Heaven, by novenas, devotions, and reading their lives.

Let us pray, too - when we are allowed access to our Churches, and then to Mass, and Holy Communion - that we will not be too quick to present ourselves to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion, without first making our Confession. Few of us, during these long weeks of lock-down, without access to the Sacraments, will be without some sin and (even if not mortal sin) would do well to go to Confession before returning to Holy Communion, so that we do not make a sacrilegious Communion (ie. without being in a state of grace). The Obligation (when it is restored for Sundays and Holy Days) is to be at Mass, not to receive Communion. These lock-down days have re-accustomed us to the value of simply being at Mass to worship, without necessarily receiving Communion every time that we’re there. Our Bishop has asked Priests to “be imaginative” in making provision for Confessions.

We arrived on 30th May 2017, and 31st May was the third anniversary of our first Mass here at the Oratory. Thank you for your welcome, your friendship, and your cooperation in the many things which have been achieved in this initial short time, by the prayers of our Founder S Philip Neri. We look forward to accomplishing so much more together in the years ahead, inspired by S Philip - bringing people closer to Jesus Christ through His Church.

The *Angelus* (below) resumes for 'Ordinary Time' while the Marian Anthem is the famous *Salve Regina* (Hail, holy Queen) with memorable tone which we sing at the end of the daily 12.15pm Mass, Evening Oratory, Benediction, etc.

*The Angelus is prayed daily: early morning, noon, and evening.
The Oratory Angelus bell rings at 7.30am, 12 noon, and 6pm.*
